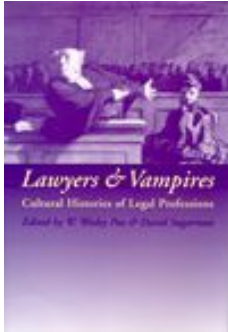

*Lawyers and Vampires*, edited by W. Wesley Pue and David Sugarman, is the first book to directly address the cultural history of the legal profession. An international team of scholars probes issues concerning the culture of the legal profession and the wider cultural significance of lawyers, including consideration of the relation to cultural processes of state formation and colonisation. The essays address aspects of the cultural history of the legal profession in 10 countries, each seeking to understand both the complex ways in which lawyers were imaginatively and institutionally constructed, and their larger cultural significance. It illustrates both the diversity and the potential of a cultural approach to lawyers in history.
